

HEALTH OFFICER PLACES APPROVAL ON COUNTY HOME

Clean Bill Given Premises By
Sanitation Inspector B. F.

A report showing the entire premises of the county home to be in excellent condition was presented to County Manager D. W. Newsom today by B. F. Rowland, health department officer who has just completed a thorough inspection at the home.

The inspection covered the main building, kitchen, sleeping quarters, dining rooms, toilets, the county infirmary, the workhouse, home for the insane, dairy, stables, and hog quarters.

Rowland reported that the sanitary condition of the entire plant was exceedingly high, and praised the manner in which all the county home departments are being maintained and operated.

Credit for this satisfactory report is due R. B. Nichols, superintendent of the county home, County Manager Newsom said. Since he took over the control of the home in December Nichols "has given much time, thought and energy to the matter of clearing the premises of all rubbish and waste and placing the entire plant in a clean and sanitary condition," Newsom stated.

The task of the county home superintendent is increased by the variety of duties for which he is responsible, Newsom said, including the care of the aged and infirm, the workhouse prisoners, the diseased, and patients who are hopelessly insane.
