The home is a miniature universe. The universe is beautiful and orderly and peaceful. So should the home be. A home should be far more than a house, but a beautiful house goes far toward making a beautiful home.

Each citizen can make his community home-conscious by making his own home beautiful. Pretty lawns, flowered gardens, clean white walks, shapely trees and well kept fences bring a satisfying sense of a well-planned and well-

ordered home, and give character and distinction to any community. There is no better index to the type of community citizenship than its homes. The home is the unit of the community. The whole is no better than its parts. For North Carolina to be beautiful and inviting, its homes must be beautiful and iniviting.
