
Dear Mr. Newsom:



NOTE:

The Merit Council controls the salaries of five state agencies that participate in State and Federal Funds, namely, The Health Department, The North Carolina Employment Service, The State Blind Commission, The State Board of Charities & Public Welfare, and the County Department of Public Welfare.
