Dear Mr. Newsom:
At the request of the Board of Public Welfare, and after a conference with Mrs. W. T. Bost, Commissioner of Public Welfare, I am enclosing a list of the duties and powers of the Welfare Department.

I hope that you will find time to read over these duties carefully. Many of them require a lot of time to do, and we have neglected this part of the work since the first of November.

We will strive to do our very best to build the department back up to standard. We sincerely trust that you will feel free to call on us for any service that we can render, that we are responsible for. We are going to do all we can to help Mr. Langston and the Citizen's Committee in the new relief organization. They have a big job, however, many of the unemployed have been given work for the past few days, and conditions are looking much brighter.

Assuring you again of the co-operation of the Board and each member of the department, I am


The County Superintendent of Public Welfare shall be the chief probation officer of every Juvenile Court in his County and shall have supervision over the work of any additional probation officer which may be appointed. Every probation officer shall have all the powers of a peace officer within the jurisdiction of the Court which he serves.

The County Superintendent of Public Welfare shall be the chief school attendance officer of the county, and shall have other duties and powers as follows:

## 1.

To have under control of the County Commission ers the care and supervision of the poor and to adininister the poor funds. This includes adinission to County Home and all relief of any kịnd.

## 2.

To act as agent of the State Board in relam tion to any work to be done by the State Board within the County. This includes the supervision and investigation of all cases of every kind that is referred by the State Department from devartments from other states, and report to the State Board of Charities and Public Welfare, the different activities of the department.
3.

Under the direction of the State Board to look after and keev up with the condition of persons discharged from hospitals for the insane and from other State institutions. This inciudes all the mentel defectives whether they be children or grom ups that are discharged from the insane asylums or cases dismissed from the Sanatorium and Orohanages, investigations for State Orthopedic Hospital and the State Blind and Deaf Institution of every child before they are admitted to the institution.
4.

To have oversight of prisoners in the County, on parole from penitentiaries, reformatories, and all parole prisoners in the County. This includes supervision of parole of all the children that are dismissed from our State Industrial Schools and also supervising the parole of all the prisoners dismissed from the county Prisons, State Penitentiary, State Hightay and Federal Prisons.

## 5.

To have ovorsight of dependent, neglected, and delinquent children, and espccially those on parole or probation. This includes all the children admitted to any of the Orphanages and the ones comitted from the Juvenile court to the State Industrial schools for the training of delinquents.
6.

To have oversight of all prisoners in the County on probation. This includes the prisoners scrving less than sịxty days in the County.

## 7.

To promote tholesome recreation in the County and to enforce such laws and regulate comercial amusement. We have a recreational department that takes care of the first vart of this duty in regard to commercial amusement that refers to obscene pictures and other things that children should not be permitted to see, and other anusements that are not wholesome.

Under the direction of the State Bowrd, to have oversight of dependent children placed in said county by the State Board. This includes all children placed in Durham County by other states through the State Board and also the State Institutions. 9.

To assist the State Board in finding employmont for the unemployed or any state agency giving ermployment to unemployed. This includes under the Governor's council of Unemployment and Relief, making reports each month cnd assisting this department 217 we con, also locai employment egency.
10.

To investigate into causes of distress, under the direction of the State Borrd, and to whe such other investigations in the interest of social welfare as the State Board may direct.
11.

Under the State Bonrd of Charities and Public
Welfare inspect 211 county institutions. This refers to seeing that the State Law is observed in our County Institutions, such as feeding the immates of the County Home and the Prisoners and sceing that they have a comfortable place to sleep. It also includes the wright receive aid jointly from the city and county, to see that the budget is kept and reports made each month to the department.
13.

Child Labor Lan provides thet no child shall Work more than 48 hours per week. The Welfere Department has to onforce this lam. This also includes street trades by children, all of them hove to have a permit from this office stating that they have complied Jith the regulations made by the Genernl Assombly. The Welfare Department has the enforcing of the "Seat Law" in the stores and menufacturing plants for momen, the inspection of toilets in stores, factories, etc, and to see that separate toilets are provided for each sex and color, same to be plainly marked over door and keep in a sanitary condition at all times, and also the enforcing of the 55 hour per week $1 a \|$ and all inspections prescribed by the Ohild Labor Departiment.
14.

Oivilian Rehnbilitation:- This cepartment is uncer the supervision of the State and Feder Government on the recommendation of the local Nelfare Department. A dult criples can be educated and trained to ern a livelihood for themselves and a family. (Last year Durhom received $\$ 2200.00$ from this part of the चork.)
15.

No child can be aroptec in the city and county of Durhan until the family is investignted by the welfare Department and report filed with the Clerk of Superior Court. This also applies to foster parents in Durham County.
16.

The case of all paupers tho die outsice of the County Home, unless it is an old soldier or widow of a soldier, has to be investigated by the Nelfore Dejertment and recommendation filed vith the County Manager before they can be given a casket or a burying place furnished.

## 17.

All onses of unmarried mothers are referred to this department for investigation and recommendntions made to the parents and courts and maternity homes.
18.

Legal resiclences: This refers especiolly to fomilies who beome copendents before they have lived in Durhom County a year. The last Legislature mace it mandatary on ench County to care for their dependents.
19.

No child can be placed in a boarding home in
the Oity ond Ocunty of Durhan until it is approved by the Feifare Dept,
20.

The last Legisloture established a Boarding Home Fund whereby the City and County coulc participate in on a fiftyfifty basis, after investigation by the Teifore Department and same recommended by the Board of Public Welfare.

T. B. Charity Patients:- Before any inclivicuad.
is admitted to the State T. B. Sanatorium at one dollar per day rate, the case has to be investigated by the Welfare Department and found worthy, and then charity rates are recommended.

There are many miscellaneous things that the Welfare Department is called upon to do, in fact, every problem that any other department can not solve is sent to the Welfare Department.
