GIRL SCOUT DAY CAMP

Day Camp for Brownie Scouts and Girl Scouts will be held at Camp Scarborough, which is located on Fayetteville Road across from Pearsontown School. It is just a short way from the end of the Fayetteville Street bus line. The camp will be under the leadership of Mrs. E. W. Butler, Director, and a staff of trained counselors.

Dates: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, June 11 - 27. Hours: 8:00 A.M. - 3:00 P.M.

Activities

Each girl will be given an opportunity to learn to live safely, comfortably, and happily out-of-doors.

Activities will include nature lore, camp crafts, outdoor cooking, folk dancing, games, singing, and exploring.

Swimming will be at Hillside Park on Mondays and Fridays, beginning June 17. Hours will be announced later.

Health and Safety

Sanitary facilities have been approved by the local health department. City water will be used for drinking. Supervised by a trained worker, a well-balanced and healthful mid-day meal including milk will be provided.

A Senior First Aider will be on duty at camp, and swimming at Hillside Park will be supervised by Red Cross Life Savers.

Each girl who plans to attend camp must have a doctor's certificate. A health check-up for this certificate will be given without charge on the first day of camp, June 11.

Registration and Cost

Registration blanks filled out and signed by the parents must be sent to the Scout Office in the City Hall by June 1. Non-Scouts will be accepted only if there is room after Scouts have been accepted. Each registration for the 9 days of Day Camp including swimming must be accompanied by payment in full as follows:
