

III. Program for the fiscal year, July 1, 1960 - June 30, 1961 .

The library seeks to continue to strengthen service to rural patrons in the northern area of Durham County by working toward the establishment of a permanent branch library in the vicinity of Bragtown and Millgrove.

The present temporary branch (1) is located in the thickly populated, home ownership, school district, and business area; (2) is included in the five year program of service to rural patrons and (3) has desirable outlets for current and prospective library service.

The need for more hours of service, basic library materials for adults, and standard library equipment and facilities in the temporary branch quarters are problems, which, if remedied will aid the present clientele and help in attracting potential library users.

Circulation for the approximately sixteen month period (Marsh<sup>c</sup> 10, 1959 - June 30, 1960) the branch library has been open totaled 4786, which gives an average monthly circulation of 299 11/8 volume. The library is open three 4-hour periods each week.

Citizens of the area have purchased land located just beyond the present quarters of the branch library. Plans are for a two room building to include a room for public and civic meetings, and use of audio-visual materials, and a room and necessary lavatory facilities for the library.
