The NEGRO HISTORY BULLETIN is an adaptation of important facts of history to the capacity of youth below the college graduate school level. The first year the aim was to cover with appropriate chapters and feature stories the whole period of American Negro History from the time of the importation from Africa up to the present day. The second year of THE NEGRO HISTORY BULLETIN was devoted to special achievements of the race — oratory, poetry, drama, music, painting, sculpture, science, invention, and the like. The third year gave a treatment from a different point of view — things in the concrete, religion, education, business, architecture, engineering, invention, pioneering, etc. The fourth year treated of the Negroes in foreign lands. The fifth of the Negroes in various sections of the United States. The sixth of the Negro and democracy. The seventh of the Negro in the mad world. The eighth of the Negro and the new order. The ninth of the Negro and reconversion. During recent years the emphasis has been on international problems and local family history.
