The Elks Lodge in Durham, Lodge no. 568, was established on April 9, 1900. The first exalted ruler in Durham was William A. Mabry. The first lodge was located in a building at the corner of Mangum and Main Streets in downtown Durham. They moved to 2670 Chapel Hill Boulevard in 1955 and are presently (as of 2016) located at 3920 S. Alston Ave
