| Biographical/Historical<br>Note:                        | The Edgemont Community Slides were part of a larger set of slides taken in the 1970s by staff from the Department of Environmental Sciences and Engineering at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.  Edgemont is the name given to the community surrounding the Durham Hosiery Mill and Golden Belt Manufacturing Company in East Durham. The community, which started in 1902, consisted not only of houses built for the mill workers, but a number of commercial establishments to service the mill workers as well. Durham Hosiery Mill ceased operations in 1938 and in 1954, Golden Belt Manufacturing Company offered the residents of the homes in Edgemont to sell them for 10% of their appraised value in an effort to reduce the costs of the company. In the late 1950s and 1960s, much of the community began to be demolished to make way for public housing developments. The demolition of homes in Edgemont continued into the 1990s, and the majority of houses in Edgemont today are modern, suburban style homes. |
