Biographical/Historical Note:	<i>The PRIDE of Durham</i> was launched in September 2003 by publisher and editor-in-chief Edwin D. Moss, as an outgrowth of <i>The PRIDE of Syracuse</i> , which Moss had started eight years earlier. It was active through 2005, when Moss passed away. A free monthly publication, <i>The PRIDE of Durham</i> sought to be the voice of Durham's African-American and Latino communities by catering to the concerns and perspectives of those communities.
