Scope and Content:	<p>The Rogers-Herr Middle School Collection contains materials related to daily school and administrative functions. A majority of items in this collection include photographs and yearbooks documenting students, faculty and staff which span the early periods of the school in the late 1960s to the present. Dedication programs highlighting Maude Rogers and Marguerite Herr for whom the school is named are also included along with newspaper clippings related to the school. School publications in the collection include "Directions" and "Rampage" faculty and PTA newsletters, as well as the student publication "We Are All About Learning" Rogers-Herr Rams Literary Magazine. Other items included are blueprints from when the school opened in 1965 and when renovations were done in 2002, dating back to the founding of the school in 1965 and recent renovation blueprints from 2002, audio-visual materials such as DVDs documenting student sport activities, and a scrapbook which provides a visual history of the school and includes letters belonging to Marguerite Herr.</p>

Biographical/Historical Note:	<p>Rogers-Herr Middle School located in Durham, North Carolina was named for longtime Durham High School teachers and friends Maud Rogers and Marguerite Herr. The school first opened its doors in 1967 as a junior high school, serving grades 7 through 9. In 1976, the school served only grades 7 and 8 before adding 6th grade in 1977. The school transitioned to year round in 2000. In 2005 Rogers-Herr was renovated to update the school facilities to better accomodate students. One unique feature about this school is its small student population which allows for faculty to focus more closely on the education of their students.</p>
