Biographical / Historical

Steve Schewel is a longtime Durham resident, community activist, and local politician. He founded the North Carolina Independent (also known as the Independent, the Independent Weekly, and now IndyWeek) in 1983, running the free, alternative newspaper for 30 years before selling it in 2012. Schewel was a member of the Durham Public Schools' Board of Education from 2004 to 2008 and was elected to the Durham City Council in 2011 where he served until his successful bid for mayor in 2017. Schewel received his MA in English from Columbia University and his BA in English and PhD in Education from Duke University, where he served as student government president and has taught as a Visiting Assistant Professor at the Sanford School of Public Policy since 2000.
