## Biographical / Historical

---

Z. E. Lewis of Lynchburg, Virginia, graduated from Union Seminary in Richmond, Virginia in 1917. Thomas Blount Fuller (July 28, 1857 - January 8, 1927) served on the Durham Public Library's original Board of Trustees with Julian S. Carr, George W. Watts, Edward J. Parrish, Robert W. Winston, L.B. Turnbull, James H. Southgate, Clinton W. Toms, Jonathan F. Wiley, Howard A. Foushee, Edwin Mims, and H. H. Markham. Fuller helped secure \$32,000 from the Carnegie Corporation for a new library building in Durham. Fuller also established a Sunday School that eventually became Edgemont Chapel, which would later become Fuller Memorial Presbyterian Church.

## Scope and Contents

---

The collection consists of a letter thanking Fuller for hosting Lewis for an October 3, 1920 visit to Durham where he was introduced to Edgemont residents in hopes of him later establishing a church with them, and requesting Fuller issue a formal call for Lewis if so desired, so he could consider coming to Durham instead of Presbyterian mission work.
