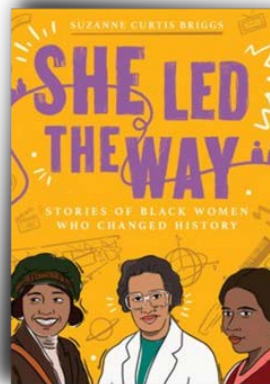
IN CASE YOU MISSED IT "WOMEN RUN DURHAM"

As promised, the video is now available for viewing online!!

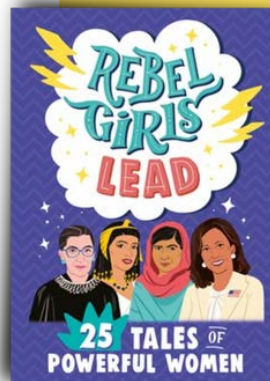
